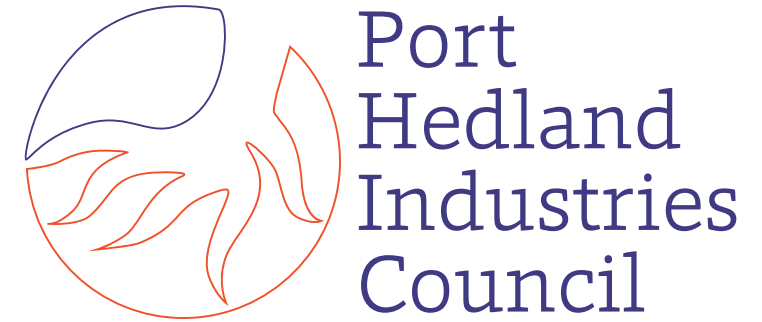

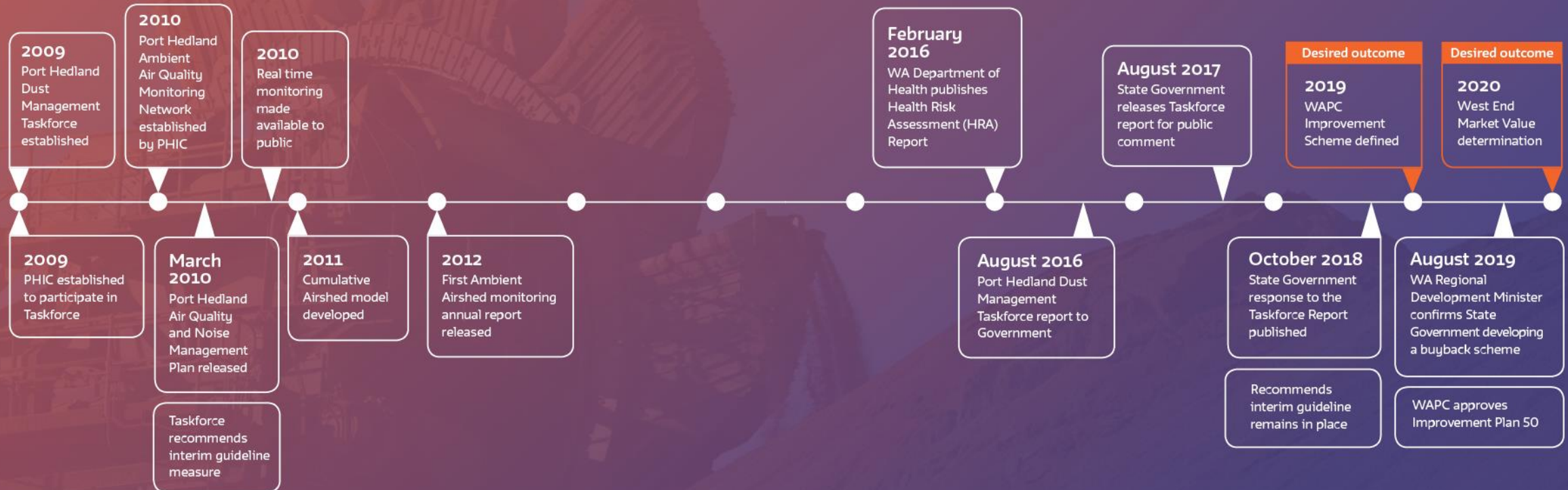

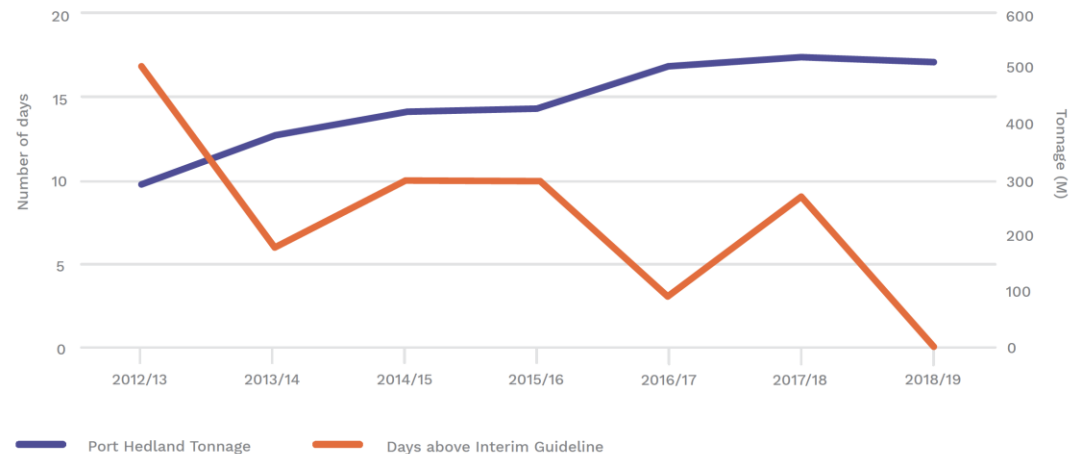

TAPLIN STREET DUST ANALYSIS IN RELATION TO INDUSTRY GROWTH

The levels of dust recorded in the West End have been relatively stable and within the guideline for exceedances over a 12-month period for several years now, despite iron ore exports through the Port of Port Hedland increasing from 280million tonnes in 2013 to more than 520million tonnes more recently.

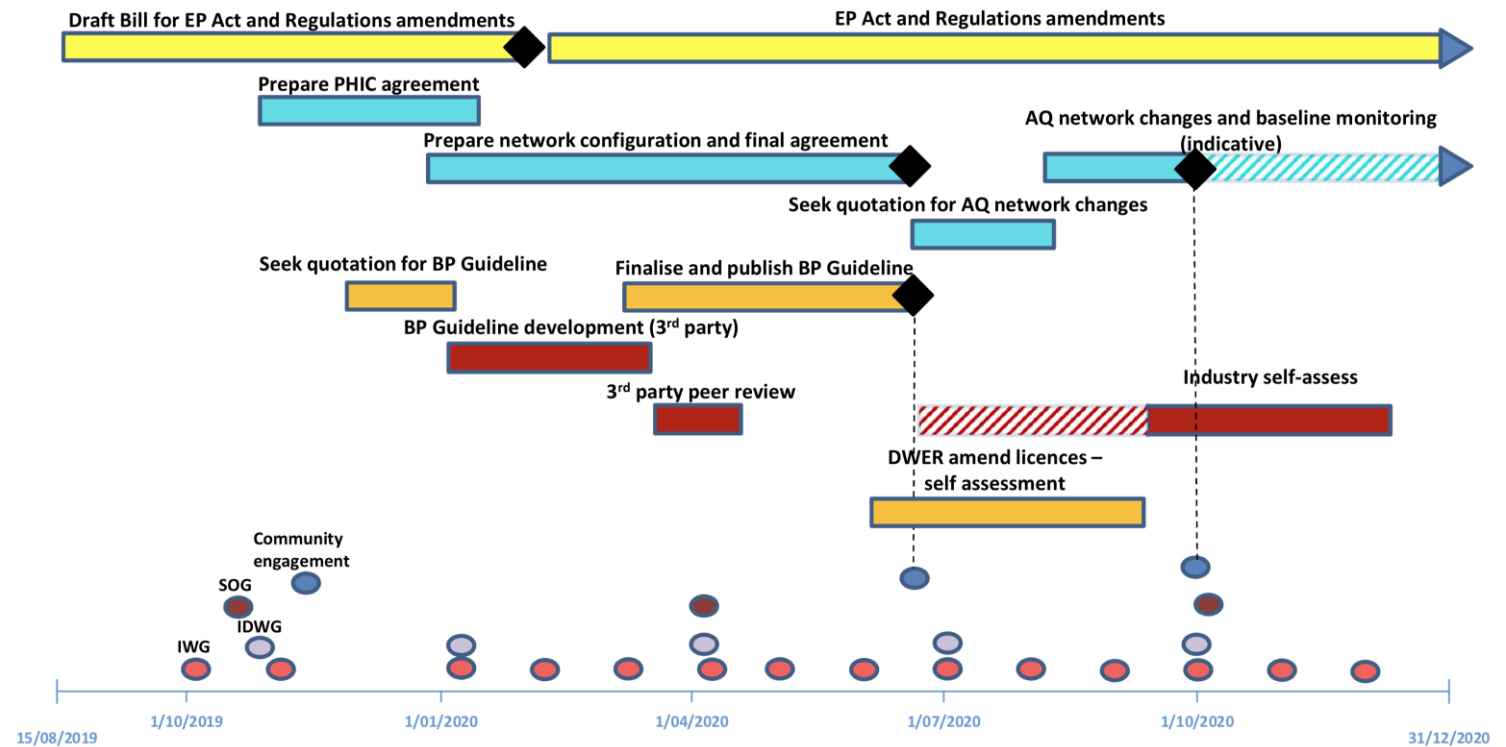
