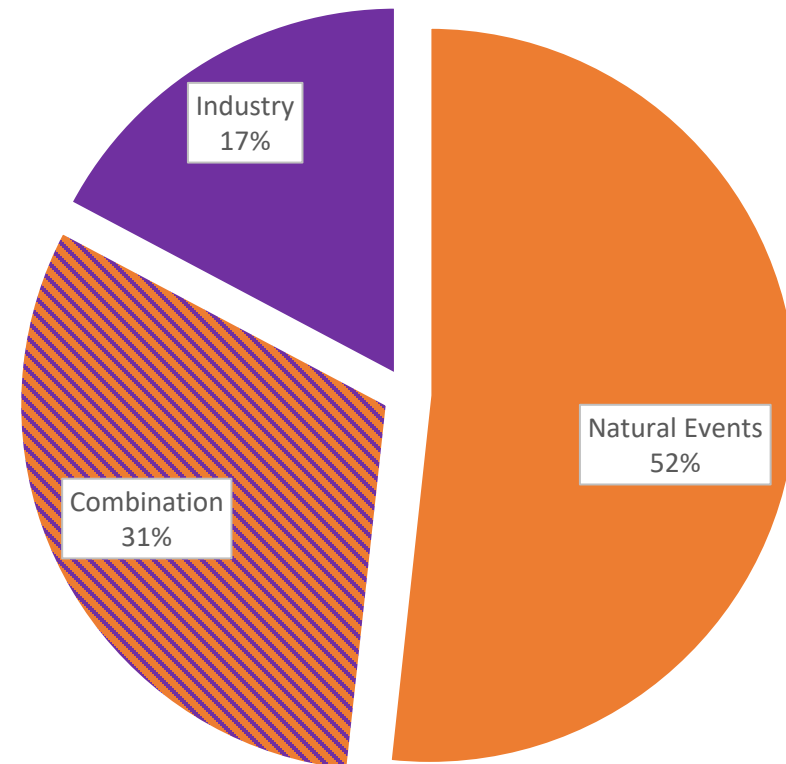

2023 draft air monitoring results – Taplin Street monitor

- The 2023 draft report was received from PHIC's independent consultant Katestone in February 2024
- A total of 29 PM₁₀ exceedances were recorded for the year
 - 15 were attributed to natural events
 - 14 exceedances have an industry contribution
 - 24 exceedances occurred during October to December
- Detailed draft assessment contributes 52% to natural events, 31% to a combination of natural, local industry and non-industry, and 17% to industry only.
- Conditions are expected to remain consistent in early 2024 during the close out of the dry season.

Regional and environmental contributors to dust exceedances

Climate

- The warmer and drier than average conditions, particularly October to December
- Positive Indian Ocean Dipole (IOD) and El Niño
 - Higher chance of below average rainfall
 - Decreased cloud cover
- Reduced vegetation growth and lower moisture content in soils and stockpiles

Prevailing winds

- Daily wind variances
- Potential for prevailing winds to rotate a full 360°, returning over the town in the same day.

Regional fires

- Regional fires in October visible in satellite imagery within ~70 km of Port Hedland.
- Bush fires within 100 km of Port Hedland December 2023 (to a limited extent).



Greater Port Hedland Vertebrate Pest Management Program (VPMP)

- Joint program to stop predatory species (foxes and feral cats) from destroying regional wildlife populations, particularly:
 - Turtles
 - Quoll
 - Birds
 - Lizards
- Fourth program scheduled for 15 to 29 April 2024.



State-Wide Array Surveillance Program (SWASP)

- Award winning, early warning marine pest surveillance in the port.

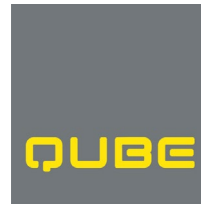
