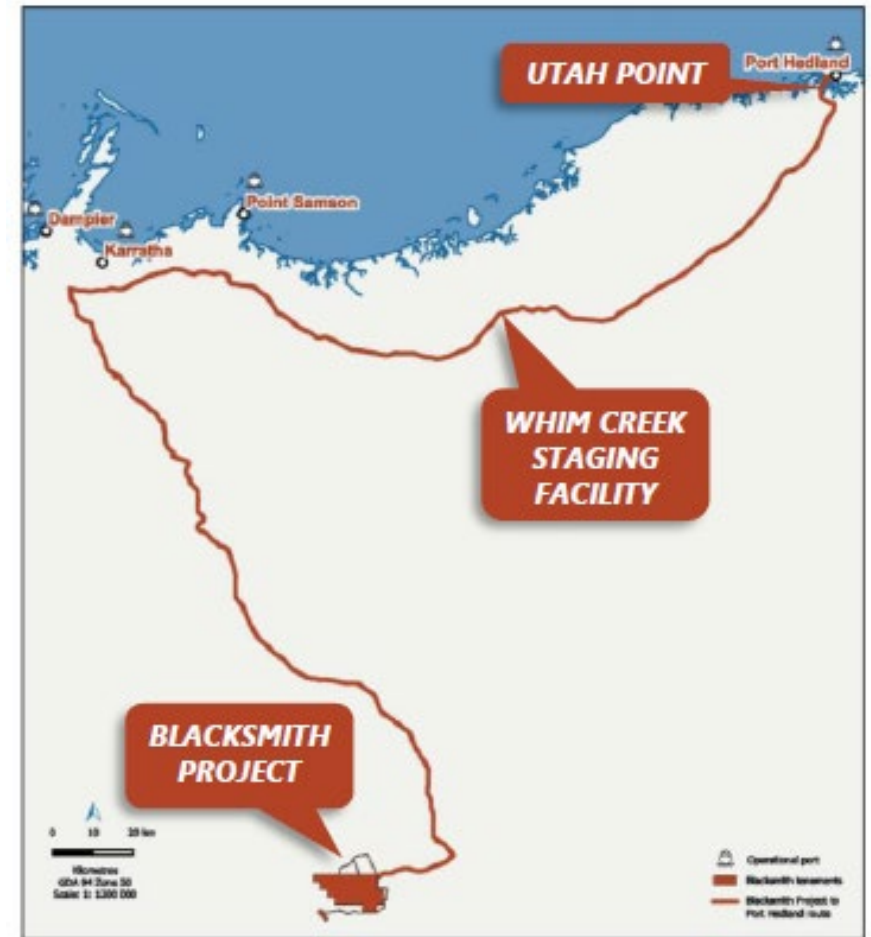
# New PHIC Industry Member



Red Hawk Mining is focussed on developing its 100%-owned Blacksmith Iron Ore Project in the Pilbara region of Western Australia.

The Blacksmith Project is located approximately 70km north-west of Tom Price and is surrounded by many major iron ore projects and significant associated road, rail and power infrastructure.

The Project has the potential to be a long-term supplier of iron ore to global steelmakers



## 2024 air monitoring results

- Twenty-three exceedances of the 24-hour average PM<sub>10</sub> in January – June 2024 verified by Katestone.
- Four exceedances over 70 µg/m<sup>3</sup> had industry contribution.
- Seventeen were natural events.
- Two were local non industry events including landscaping and demolition nearby.

## Marine Environmental Quality Monitoring Program FY23 annual report card



### Environmental quality objectives (EQOs)

- Water quality** Water quality is suitable to maintain a healthy ecosystem.
- Sediment** Sediment quality is suitable to quality maintain a healthy ecosystem.
- Recreation** The area is safe for swimming and diving.

- Secondary contact** The area is safe for boating and fishing.
- Aesthetics** The aesthetic appeal of the environment is protected.

Our annual report card summarises the outcomes of monitoring completed during the financial year (FY) 23 (1 July 2022 to 30 June 2023). Where an indicator is not assessed, for example Recreation at IH1-IH4, it is typically due to the activity not being supported at that location (i.e. swimming within the inner harbour).
