#### **Mission To Seafarers**

- Established 1836 providing pastoral care to seafarers on ships on the Thames River, England
- A mission of the Anglican Church with headquarters in London
- Over 200 operations in ports around the world in 50 countries
- Port Hedland is one of 30 missions in Australia



#### **Port Hedland Peace Memorial Seafarers Centre**

- Current Centre opened in 1973
- Busiest MTS centre in Australia. Around 80,000 seafarers arrive every year. About 13,000 of them get shore leave.



#### **Seafarers Centre Services**

- Pastoral care
- Ship visits
- Transport (generally Jetty, Centre, Shops)
- Foreign Exchange (USD, EUR and AUD)
- Retail shopping (souvenirs, groceries)
- SIM cards
- Online shopping (delivery to ship- groceries, souvenirs, sim cards)
- Hospitality (food, drinks)
- Free Wifi at the PHSC to contact family and entertainment
- Recreation facilities including sports, games, TV
- Lounge and relaxation areas
- Free books and clothing

## Green light for funding for Port Hedland Seafarers Centre

The Cook Labor Government will deliver a new fit-for-purpose Seafarers Centre in Port Hedland to cater for the tens of thousands of seafarers who bring ships into the town's bustling port each year.

- Cook Government supporting new \$13.5 million investment in Seafarers Centre for Port Hedland's West End
- · Procurement for the new facility to get underway this year
- · Industry will work with Pilbara Ports to design, fund and construct the new centre

The Cook Labor Government will deliver a new fit-for-purpose Seafarers Centre in Port Hedland to cater for the tens of thousands of seafarers who bring ships into the town's bustling port each year.

The \$13.5 million cost of the new centre will initially be funded as part of the 2024-25 State Budget, with those costs to be recovered from industry via a shipping charge, with agreed contributions from port users BHP, Fortescue, Roy Hill, Mineral Resources Limited and Atlas Iron.

The investment builds on the State Government's contribution of more than \$2 million, through Pilbara Ports, for the purchase of land for the new facility.

#### **Seafarers**

- 9 month contract
- Minimum wages USD \$614 per month (equivalent AUD \$800)
- Nationalities Filipino, Indian, Chinese
- Less than 2% females
- Only 3-4 opportunities for shore leave in 9 months
- Collective personal local spend in Port Hedland of over \$900,000 per year
