Fortescue Innovation Grant

The Introduction of the **Fortescue Innovation Grants** aligns with Fortescue's decarbonisation and green energy initiatives.

The inaugural round was open for the month of October and provided eligible community organisations with the opportunity to apply for up to \$25,000 to support innovation projects promoting access to green energy and sustainable practices, aligning with our real-zero commitments.

In Hedland, Julyardi Aboriginal Corporate were awarded \$25,000 for their Mayaka project,

which is the Kariyarra word for "Pharmacy."

The FIG will fund the purchase of gardening equipment as well as the costs associated with documenting the growth cycle of bush medicine. Additionally, the funds will be used to deliver educational programs to the community.

The garden will be established at Julyardi's new South Hedland facility.



Safe Spaces – Port Hedland & Newman





Commencing in mid-2025 in Port Hedland and Newman, the program will provide a safe, temporary environment for vulnerable young people at night, offering adult supervision and support services.

Fortescue and BHP jointly funded -\$22 million to establish the Safe Spaces program over five years under the Resources Community Investment Initiative (RCII).

The state government is contributing \$7.3 million over the same period to establish and deliver an Indigenous Healing Service for Newman and to service the program.
