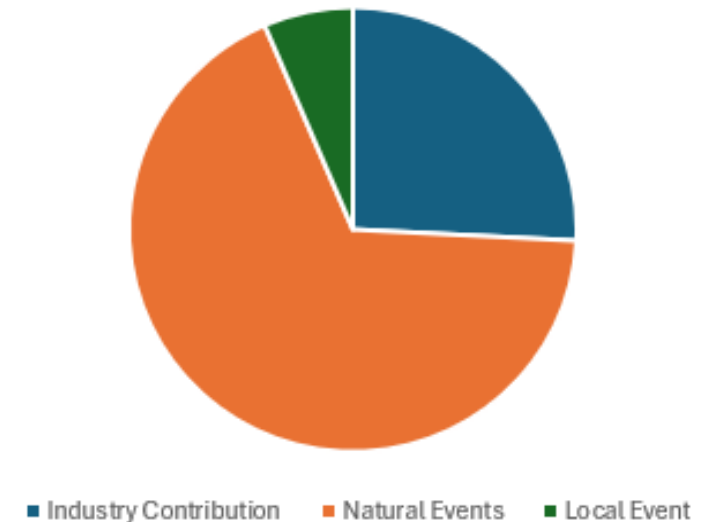
Port Hedland Ambient Air Monitoring

2024 air monitoring results

- Thirty-one exceedances of the 24-hour average PM10 in January – December 2024 verified by Katestone.
- All exceedances have background contribution.
- Eight exceedances over 70 µg/m³ had industry contribution.
- Twenty-one were natural events.
- Two were local events only which included landscaping and demolition nearby.

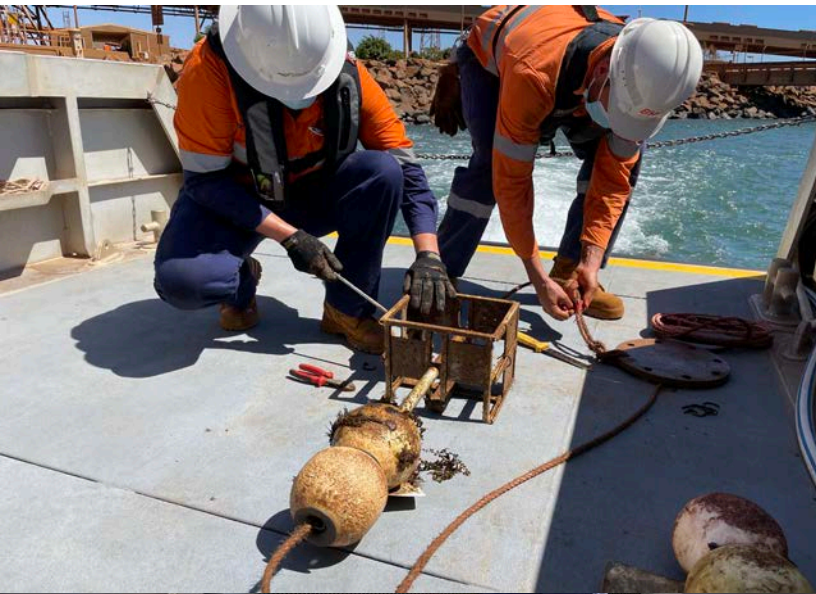
2024 Taplin Exceedance Results

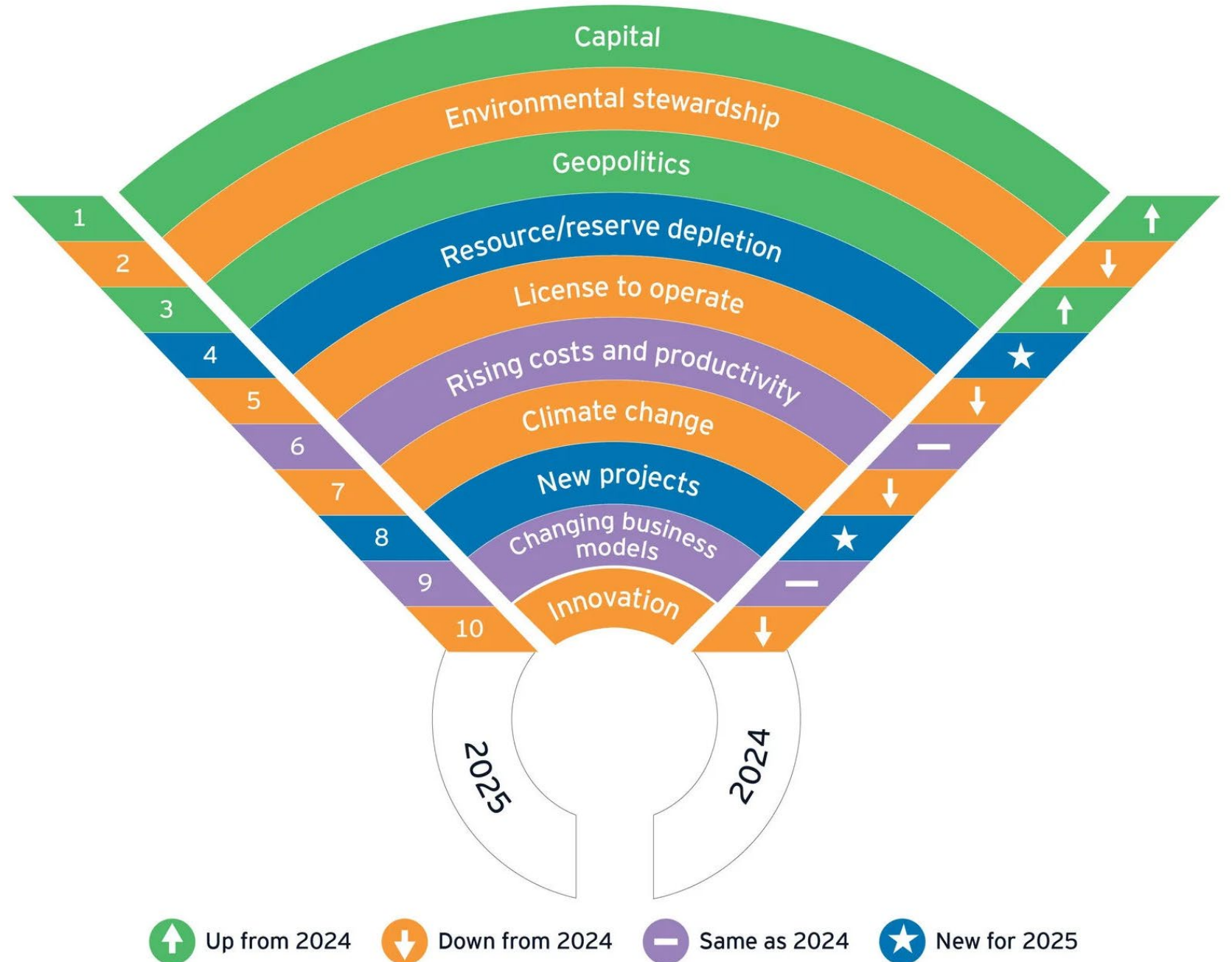
